Magistrate Judges in the country; Assistant United States Attorney, 1970 - 1975 Western District of Louisiana Shreveport, Louisiana; Private Practice of Law, 1967 - 1970 Seale, Smith, Baine & Phelps Baton Rouge, La.; Louisiana State University, 1959-1963; Louisiana State University School of Law 1963-1967, Juris Doctor. As clerk/court administrator, Magistrate Judge Shemwell has overseen and managed the growth of a court operation consisting of four (4) judges and thirteen (13) deputy clerks to a court operation of seventeen (17) judges, eight (8) court reporters, and fifty-one (56) deputy clerks. Under his tenure, the Clerk's Office has introduced automation into the court and managed several national pilot programs, including SIRS (a case management system for federal courts) and an electronic courtroom project.

United States District Court for the Western District of Louisiana; Appointed to the Bench: November 15, 1991 by President George Bush; Louisiana State University Law Center - Baton Rouge, Louisiana - Juris Doctorate - 1991; Northwestern State University - Natchitoches, Louisiana - 1973 Bachelor of Arts -Speech and English, 1975 Master of Arts - Speech.
