The impact of the Senate's recent changes to its floor rules governing the confirmation of judicial and executive nominees also will be analyzed. Attendees will learn about how the federal bar can assure the nomination of the best judicial candidates and the prompt filling of judicial vacancies at the federal district and circuit court levels.
