S. 1953, Tribal Law and Order Act Reauthorization and Amendments Act of 2016

• PURPOSES:

- Additional tools to reduce crime, jail overcrowding, recidivism, and juvenile delinquency

- Clarify federal, state, tribal responsibilities for crime in Indian Country

- Extend certain authorizations

TRIBAL LAW AND ORDER ACT OF 2010

- Public safety crisis
- Comprehensive approach to improve effectiveness of criminal justice
- Increase capacity of tribal governments and law enforcement agencies in coordination for and managing public safety

 Goals: Reduce violent crime, combat sexual and domestic violence, reduce drug trafficking and rates of drug and alcohol addiction, standardize interagency info sharing, encourage hiring and training of law enforcement officers.

JUVENILE JUSTICE

 No special Federal juvenile division (judges, probation, detention, diversion, or rehabilitation facilities)

No required notice to tribal government
