## SECTION ON INTERNATIONAL LAW

On June 27, the FBA International Law Section collaborated with the Cuban American Bar Association to host an exclusive event (and webinar) on Title III of the Helms-Burton Act. For the first time in history, Title III was not suspended by the president, allowing lawsuits to proceed against any defendant trafficking in property that was confiscated by the Cuban government. The first panelist was Jason Ian Poblete, attorney and principal of Poblete Tamargo LLP, based in Washington, D.C. Poblete is an expert in national security and international law who focuses his practice on compliance with U.S. economic sanctions and export control laws. The second panelist was Javier A. Lopez, partner at Kozyak Tropin & Throckmorton LLP in Miami who has particular expertise in advising and representing international clients in matters brought in U.S. federal and state court. The panel discussed the statutory requirements for bringing a Title III claim as well as some of the hurdles and preclusions that claimants may face. The FBA International Law Section's Vice Chair Stephanie M. Gomez is an associate
