KEYNOTE SPEAKERS



HON. BEVERLEY McLACHLIN
CHIEF JUSTICE, SUPREME COURT OF CANADA

Chief Justice McLachlin was educated at the University of Alberta, where she received a B.A., an M.A., and an LL.B. She taught for seven years at the University of British Columbia as a tenured associate professor. Chief Justice McLachlin's judicial career began in April 1981,

when she was appointed to the Vancouver County Court. In September 1981, she was appointed to the Supreme Court of British Columbia. She was elevated to the British Columbia Court of Appeal in 1985 and was appointed chief justice of the Supreme Court of British Columbia in 1988. Seven months later, she was sworn in as a justice of the Supreme Court of Canada. On Jan. 7, 2000, she was appointed Chief Justice of Canada; she is the first woman to hold this position.



HON. PATRICIA A. MILLETT
U.S. CIRCUIT JUDGE, U.S. COURT OF APPEALS FOR THE D.C. CIRCUIT

Judge Millett was appointed to the U.S. Court of Appeals on Dec. 10, 2013. She graduated from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign and from Harvard Law School. After working at Miller & Chevalier for two years, she

clerked for Hon. Thomas Tang of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. Following her clerkship, she worked for four years on the appellate staff of the Civil Division in the U.S. Department of Justice and for 11 years as an assistant in the Office of the Solicitor General. In September 2007, she became a partner leading the Supreme Court and appellate practices at Akin Gump Strauss Hauer & Feld LLP. She has argued 32 cases before the U.S. Supreme Court.
