PROGRAM INFORMATION

<p>OVERVIEW</p> <p>Teachers can schedule their class to join semi-private exchanges, allowing students to review the materials with scholars in a smaller group to promote deeper understanding and enhance opportunities for civil discourse and discussion.</p>	<p>GOAL</p> <p>Scholar Exchanges were created to balance information and conversation. Students are encouraged to ask questions, respond to questions posed by the scholar and moderator, and reflect on what the scholar shares.</p>

SCHOLAR INFORMATION

<p>ROLE</p> <p>The scholar is asked to share information about the constitutional topic—addressing its historical foundations, changing interpretations, and modern questions. Additionally, the scholar is encouraged to share how the Constitution impacts their professional lives. This connection between the document and real life provides students will additional insight that a regular class would not be able to provide.</p>	<p>RESOURCES</p> <p>The Center’s education team will provide a script, slide show presentation, technological support before each session to support the scholar. During the Scholar Exchange, there will be a moderator from the Center to monitor the chat, navigate the slide show presentation, and provide any necessary content-specific support.</p>

<p>WHEN</p> <p>Programs are scheduled Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays. There are between two-three programs scheduled each day. There is an overview of dates and times available.</p>	<p>HOW</p> <p>The Center will provide a Zoom link to the participating classes and the scholar. Sometimes, teachers will request to hold the session on a different platform, such as Google, but those sessions are on a case-by-case basis.</p>	<p>WHAT</p> <p>Topics rotate seasonally and include the Bill of Rights, Freedom of Speech, Principles of the American Revolution, the Fourth Amendment, and more.</p>
